



Accomplishments include:

- Established 75% of the nation's libraries and the national model for juvenile courts.
- Supported legislation for the 8-hour workday; the first child labor law; and equal pay for equal work.
- Started an alcohol and drug abuse education program for women and children.
- Instituted a youth suicide prevention program.

Introduction of Guests: Guests visiting the club today are Edith Glassey and Jackie Hinek from Project Safe House and Denise Graham, a guest of Liz Harris. Lisa thanked today's hostesses, Sharon Smith, Marilyn Saunders and Pat Meacham. Carolyn Fulford and Terry Burke-Eiserling birthdays were recognized.

We enjoyed a delicious lunch catered by Babalisa Catering Company (Barbara Meyer and Lisa Sharp). Following lunch, Lisa asked members to sign up to donate a basket that will be raffled off each month. Following lunch, Liz Harris introduced her guest Denise Graham, who plans on joining the woman's club.

Our guest, Edith Glassey, from Project Safe House, shared with us how the organization got started in 1988 and up to 2017 they have served 20,000 men and women. Not only does Project Safe House serve people in need, in addition they also provide counseling and legal services for free. Jackie Hinek, Project Safe House manager, shared that they have a hot line where those in need can call for help. Clients can stay at the safe house between 28 and 45 days. Also provided, if needed, is law enforcement and lawyers. Today our club donated \$528 to Project Safe House.

Minutes from our last meeting with corrections made were filed.

Treasurer, Martha Kraling, said that we had a total of \$6,953.96 cash on hand and there are pending deposits of \$90. Dues are now due and are \$25.

President's Message: Lisa spoke about the new club members' participation and encouraged them to get involved with a committee and also thanked all the members for their involvement and help with club projects. Lisa thanked the various chairs on all that they accomplished in 2017. She went on to thank Carolyn Fulford for chairing the 2017 Art Show and for Gloria Rinehart taking over the Art Show in 2018; Liz Harris for PAL, It's Not Okay, and Relay for Life. Lisa thanked the board members for their help and support.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business: Members were asked to sign up for a month to host a club meeting in 2018. Barbara Whitlock spoke about Tir Na Nog, a horse sanctuary which rescues horses from abuse, abandonment or neglect. The Land of The Young Sanctuary is located in Descanso. Barbara said the club made \$405 at the Spirit of Christmas and that with what the club donated was a total of \$775. Nancy DeGreif encouraged members to come to the Tuesday Sewing Group and see what projects are being worked on. Lisa encouraged members to come to the sewing group and told them they don't need to sew to join in. Carolyn Bass said there is an upcoming visit on Saturday January 20, 2018, to Chula Vista for a Tea/Fashion Show (several of our members will be models) New Year, New You; the cost is \$30 which includes lunch. Terry Burke-Eiserling thanked everyone for their donations to the Lakeside Help Center. She also shared Lakeside news and up-dated the club on Lakeside's ongoing problems with the illegal marijuana shops. Happy Thoughts were shared followed by the recitation of the Collect.
